## Social and Political Involvement of Muslim Women In Europe: France

- Official representation of Islam in France was solidified by an agreement signed on July 2001 called Conseil Francais du Culte Musulman (French Council of Muslim Faith), which established a national elected body to serve as the official representation of Islam within the French state.
- Immigrant associations across France organize themselves as "une politique musulmane" (political Muslim) to increase their voice on future elections.
- ❖ Political involvement of Muslim women in France includes positions such as Justice Minister, undersecretary for human rights, and undersecretary for urban affairs, ¹ Secrétaire d'Etat au Développement durable (Secretary of State), and as European Deputies.
- ❖ In the last European Union elections of 1999, with 3 Franco-Maghrebian women were elected out of 23 French citizens of Maghrebian background on the ballots participating in 9 electoral lists ranging from far right to the extreme left.<sup>2</sup>
- ❖ There are numerous political movements initiated by French Muslim women. La Femmes Musulmanes et Engages (French Muslim Women's Political Engagement) and Lique des Femmes Muslimanes (League of Muslim Women), for example, encourage civic and political activism, inspiring human agency within Muslim women.<sup>3</sup>
- Social organizations such as Ni Putes Ni soumises<sup>4</sup> (Neither Whores nor Doormats), a French feminist movement founded by a Franco-Algerian woman, fights against violence targeting Muslim women with over 6000 members and numerous local branches.<sup>5</sup>
