Put your name, your email address, your phone#, your university department and affiliation, and the date on the front cover. Paginate. Send to Suad Joseph (sjoseph@ucdavis.edu); Dina El Sherbeny (dinasherbeny@aucegypt.edu) by November 25. You will have daily writing assignments in the workshop. Be prepared to make time for homework!

- 1. What is the question you wish to answer? (problem statement)
- 2. What is your tentative answer to the question? (hypothesis)
- 3. How have others answered this question? (literature review)
- 4. Why are those answers inadequate? (need for research)
- 5. Why is your answer to this question better than of others? (theory)
- 6. What is the value added by answering this question? (Significance)
- 7. How will you go about answering this question (methods)
- 8. How will you know when you have answered the question (evaluation)
- 9. How much time will it take to answer the question (Timetable)
- 10. How much will it cost to answer this question (Budget)
